For Cost Center 36 there is a positive variance to budget of \$23,666 for the month of October, 2014. The variance is due to the following:

- a. A \$26,875 positive variance for Display Advertising and a \$1,499 positive variance for Classified/Over-the-Counter Advertising in October. The primary drivers were additional income from:
 - Medicare Open Enrollment advertising
 - · Political advertising
 - · Minibus schedule advertising
 - · Oct.-Dec. are traditionally high-income months
- b. A \$5,554 negative variance for the cost of printing the newspaper in October. The primary drivers were
 - Additional editorial pages (an average of four pages per issue) held for late submissions
 - (Note: these pages have not been regularly used, and so we're stopping w/11/20 issue)
 - Since the late-submission pages tended to push an issue to 40 pages, delivery costs also increased by \$618 for October, 2014.
