No Smoking - Trust Property

 - Shuffleboard Courts
 - Golf Course
- 3. Smoking* or other use of tobacco and/or marijuana products (including, but not limited to, cigarettes, e-cigarettes, pipes, cigars, hookahs snuff, all forms or smokeless tobacco or chewing tobacco) is not permitted.
 - 3.1 Includes a presumptively reasonable minimum distance, as set forth as twenty-five feet from entrances, exits, windows that open, and ventilation intakes that serve an enclosed area where smoking is prohibited
 - *Smoking refers to inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying of any lighted or heated tobacco/marijuana product, as well as non-tobacco smoking substances and smoking instruments.
- Violations of this policy by Shareholders/Members, guests and staff may result in disciplinary action. Anyone in violation will be asked to comply with the policy or leave Trust Property.

A smoke/tobacco-free environment is an essential element to creating and maintaining a culture of health and safety.

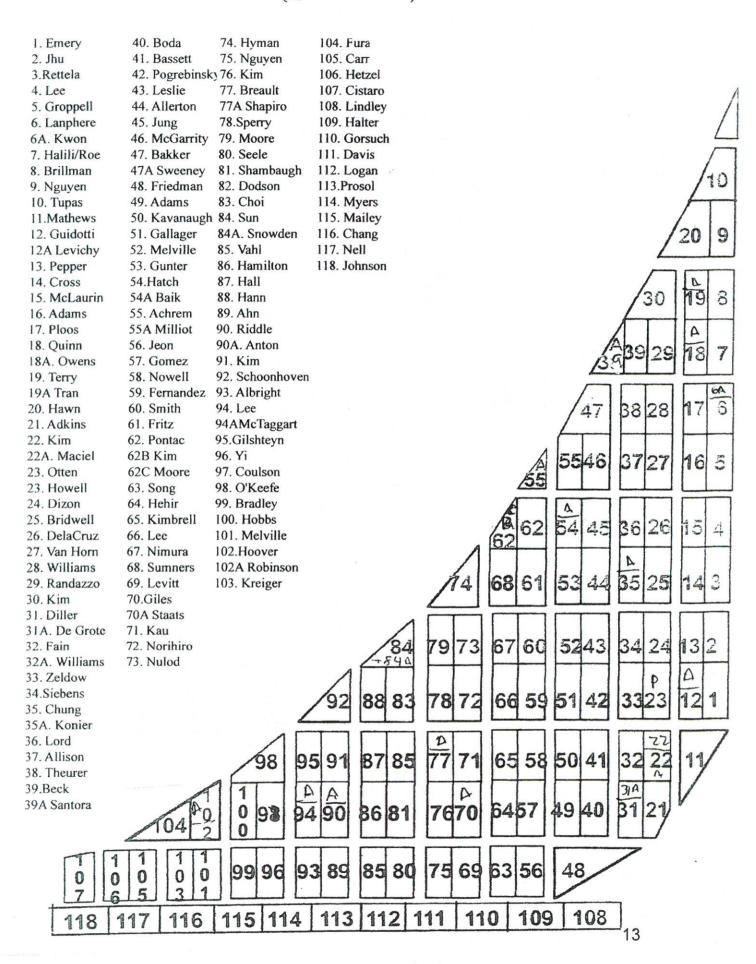

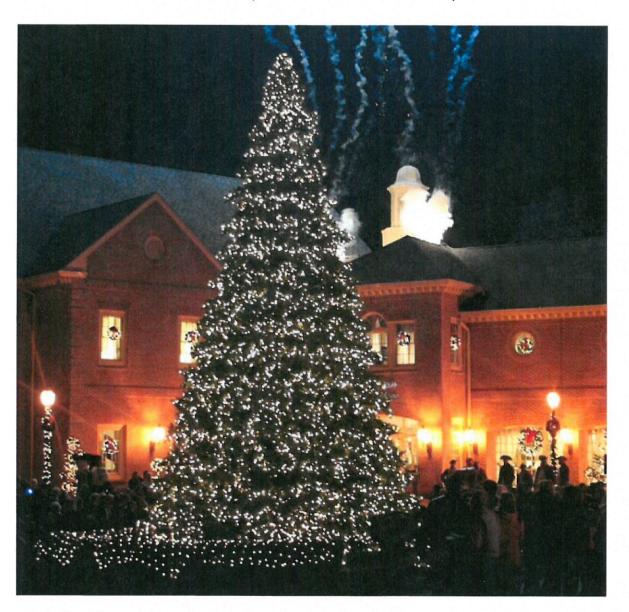

Music for dances during the Amphitheater season will be a responsibility of the Recreation Department.

- 3. Foundation members are able to invite guests as long as the number of guests does not comprise a majority of the attendees.
- A person who provides live-in, long-term, or hospice care to a Foundation member is classified as a caregiver. Access to any Foundation community function or amenity is solely limited to that of attendant to the Foundation member for whom service if being rendered.
