A prospective purchaser of a Leisure World Mutual Membership need only determine what their personal needs are.

<u>Assisted Living:</u> Assisted Living facilities offer personalized supportive services and assistance with day-to-day living needs. Meals, snacks, housekeeping, physical fitness, laundry and 24-hour trained staff members are all provided under the umbrella of assisted-living services. These <u>are not</u> services provided at Seal Beach Leisure World.

<u>Active Adult Community:</u> In Seal Beach Leisure World you can be as active as you choose to be. There are many recreational opportunities. Members who purchase the right to reside in a Mutual apartment, direct their own lives and are independent and able to handle their own affairs.

In accordance with Mutual Policy 7510, Eligibility Requirements, item (3), prospective applicants for ownership and residency should have reasonably good health for a person of his/or her age and be able to live independently as evidenced in the form of a letter provided by the applicant's treating physician on the physician's letterhead stationery.

Reasonably good health may be described in part as an applicant's ability to:

•Dress self with weather-appropriate clothing.	Able to shop and preparing meals, or eat out.
•Maintain a clean, safe living environment.	If needed able to medicate self properly.
■Bath (shower) & maintain personal hygiene.	Able to take care of personal finances.

Choosing an active adult community is a decision which should be made with the assistance of loved ones, professional healthcare physicians, legal advisors and others. Please allow us to answer any questions you might have regarding qualification for residency in this community.  - Assist 125 clients in applying for BEC programs
- Estimated savings/client: \$1,243 a year
 - Total estimated savings \$155,375/year
