Chair and Co-Chairperson

The Emergency Information Council will be presided over by a Chair/Co-Chairperson. It is the responsibility of the Chairperson to:

- Schedule/coordinate meetings and agendas (include topics for discussion).
- Encourage voluntary participation on specific subcommittees as needed.
- Reach out to subject matter experts.
- Include presentation discussion outcome in meeting agenda.
